-  Interim patrol meeting(s) will be held as planned by the patrol members.
-  Attendance at **both** weekends **and** the patrol meeting(s) is required.

Part II: The Application Phase

After the Practical Phase, you will fulfill a contract with yourself through your "Ticket" – five Scouting goals that you'll establish and then complete over the next 18 months.



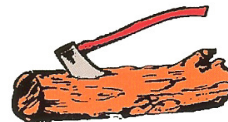

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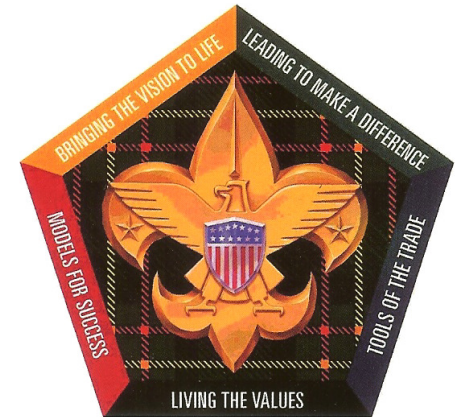

Where does the Course take place?

Both weekends will be at Schiff Scout Reservation, Wading River, NY. Classroom sessions and meals take place in and around our dining hall on weekend one. Weekend two is mostly an in-camp, outpost experience practicing basic patrol camping.

What does the Course cost?

The course fee is \$285.00. Early registration fee (paid in full by 6/1/12) is \$250. All food, instructional materials and recognition are included. A \$50.00 deposit reserves your place on Gilwell Field. The course is limited to 48 participants, so please don't delay — send your deposit to reserve your place now. Cancellations will be transferred to reserve a position in next year's course.

What is Required to Participate?

-  Be registered as an adult leader in the BSA
-  Complete the training course specific for your scouting position
-  Provide the Annual Health and Medical Record form valid through October 2012
-  Bring to the course an eagerness to learn ... and a willingness to have a lot of fun
